
Installation Instructions

40/60 or 60/40 Split Bench or solid bench

Headrest: You will need to remove the headrest prior to installing your seat covers. Please note

- this only applies to headrests which are fully adjustable.
- Some vehicles will come with built-in headrest or folding headrest where you DO NOT need to remove the headrest.
- In some cases you will need to fully lift the headrest, exposing a pin hole on the opposite base which will allow you to remove it.
- In any case where you are not able to remove the headrest covers proceed to contact our support team via phone (800)846-8621 or email Support@Caltrend.com for assistance.
- You will need to align the headrest cover next to the headrest. This will allow you to determine the
 position the headrest needs to be installed.


TIPS FOR HEADREST REMOVAL



Button Removal: Most vehicles have headrests that are removed simply by pushing one or two buttons on the plastic cap that surrounds the headrest post.

Pinhole Removal: For other vehicles there is a small hole on either plastic molding. A paper clip or a pin will need to be inserted to push the release inside the plastic.

Button & Pinhole Removal: Some vehicles require inserting a pin into the pinhole and simultaneously pushing a button on the other plastic molding.



Clip Removal: Very few vehicles have a small clip under the plastic cap. Once you locate the ends of the clip, use a screwdriver to push the clip out the other side.


Rotating Cap: Some vehicles like the older Jeep Cherokee have a circular plastic cap that needs to be rotated counter-clockwise in order to take out headrests.

Buttons Under Upholstery: There are a few luxury vehicles (like Volvo) that have buttons hidden under the original upholstery. Push inward on the button(s) to release headrest.

Remove Cushion (if applicable): First confirm if you have a 60/40 or solid bottom cushion.

- You will need to remove the bottom cushion for most **sedan** vehicles.
- This will only apply if you have a **SOLID CUSHION.**
- There will either be a pressure clip on each end where you will need to firmly push up OR have a clip with a locking mechanism that you will need to slightly pull or rotate.
- Please note some of these cushions may also be hooked on the rear section with an added bracket.
- You will need to press down on the rear section of the seat and pull towards the front to undo the bracket.
- This DOES NOT apply to trucks or most SUVs as the cushion folds up.







Install Cushions:

- Detach all the male buckles from the cushions
- Some Trucks and SUVs will have a 40/60 cushion while others a 60/40 cushion. The installation process
 will be identical for both of these vehicles. (These vehicles might also come with a solid cushions, the
 process will remain the same)
- Most sedan vehicles will come with a solid cushion.
- Align the covers to the cushion, so that all the cut outs align properly.
- Note some covers will have 2 cut outs per side for child hooks.
- Run the straps across from each other and attach them accordingly.
- Occasionally some bottom cushions will come with either elastics with S-hooks or white plastic tabs.
 The S-hooks will attach under the cushion while the plastic tabs will just tuck in between the seat.
 (Applies to most non removable cushions)
- If applicable attach the Velcro strips underneath the cushions carpeting.

Install Backrest:

- Detach all the buckles from the backrest **if applicable**.
- Note the majority of the backrest on sedan vehicles will come with Velcro's which will attach together or to the carpeting of the vehicle.
- Some Trucks and SUVs will have a 40/60 backrest while others a 60/40. The installation process will be identical for MOST of these vehicles. (These vehicles might also come with a solid backrest; the process will remain the same).
- Most sedan vehicles will come with a solid backrest while others might have a 60/40 or 40/60 backrest. The installation process will remain the same.
- Fold the cushion up as this will bring the backrest forward about 1 inch (applies to most Trucks only).

60/40 or 40/60 Cushions

- You will need to remove the male buckle from the longest strap as this will allow you to properly feed the strap behind the backrest.
- Make sure to pass the 60% backrest under the integrated seat belt located on the middle.
- Once the straps are properly attached you will need to firmly tighten them by pulling up.
- You will need to pass the side to side strap under the seat and over the seat belt anchor if any, then
 attach to the opposite side and firmly tighten it.
- If your vehicle has an armrest/Cup holder the backrest cover will have a cut out made to cover the back section.

Armrest/Cup Holder Tray & Side Panels (Optional):

- The armrest/cup holder tray will come with Velcro on the backside which will attach to together.
- The side panels will need to be aligned properly. They will have white plastics around which will tuck in between the plastic trim of the vehicle.
